MUST SEE DI SPLAY AT THE MUSEUM



As part of 'Exhibit of Fortnight', the children's section at the Government Museum, has displayed a model of 'S. S. Irwin Ship'.

The ship, built in 1929 in Glasgow, was bought by the South Indian Railway Company to operate between Dhanushkodi, Rameswaram Island and Talaimannar Pier in Mannar Island, Sri Lanka. The ship was put on service in 1930. The tonnage of the ship is 970.11 gross, and 377.39 registered. The overall length and breadth are 259 feet and 38 feet respectively. Its passenger carrying capacity in fair and rough weather is 1552 and 1045 respectively. The normal speed of the ship is approximately 10 knots.

The ferry service was suspended following a cyclonic disaster that hit Dhanushkodi of Rameswaram Island on December 22, 1964.

The model presented to this museum by Southern Railway will be kept on display till March 24. For details, contact Govt. museum phone no. 2819 3238.

FOR THE NOTES:

Gross tonnage is a unitless index related to a ship's overall internal volume. Gross tonnage is calculated by measuring a ship's volume (from keel to funnel, to the outside of the hull framing) and applying a mathematical formula.

Register tonnage is a ship's total internal volume expressed in 'register tons, one of which equals a volume of 100 cubic feet (2.83 m3). It is calculated from the total permanently enclosed capacity of the vessel.

FLOWERS

Have you seen these purple flowers blooming all over Chennai?

It is the *Pungai* tree (Millettia pinnata) that blossoms during early summer and spreads strong fragrance. The dense shade it provides slows the evaporation of surface water. It is often used for landscaping purposes as a windbreak or for shade due to the large canopy and showy fragrant flowers.

While the oil and residue of the plant are toxic and will induce nausea and vomiting if ingested, the fruits and sprouts, along with the seeds, are used in many traditional remedies. Juices from the plant, as well as the oil, are antiseptic and resistant to pests.

Money Matters

Black money under arrest? Aishwaraya D Kalro, Student Reporter of YOCee checks the story behind the withdrawal of currency notes issued before 2005.

On January 22, 2014, the Reserve Bank of India's much-speculated note exchange policy sent out shock waves to all currency hoarders.

In a bid to curb black money and counterfeit notes, the RBI has decided to withdraw currency notes issued prior to 2005 from circulation.

With inflation on-the-rise and debts ruling high, the RBI's new move aims at

increasing the security of the Indian rupee as those with tax-evaded money may suddenly show higher turnover and profits in the business, thereby paying more excise duty, sales tax and income tax. Taxes paid by the citizens contributes to a major chunk of income for the government and is expected to boost government's revenues.

RBI's smart move of arresting unaccounted money, shall bring becomes an easy process as there is a down the high rate of fiscal deficit which

sky-rocketed to \$86 Billion! According to many bankers and experts, black money and counterfeit notes are responsible for price rise. When taxevaded money will get back in circulation, economists foretell that there is a good probability for the recovery of the Indian Economy, which seems to be in a critical state.

In a conversation with the Branch Manager of one of Union Bank of India's city branches, Mr. Sundaram explained that the notes were never banned and would still continue to be a legal tender. He adds that notes can be exchanged before the extended deadline January 1, 2015. Further says that soiled or torn notes can be exchanged too.

While an account holder can get the

notes exchanged with very limited formalities, a non-account holder must furnish proof of identity and residence if he wishes to exchange more than 10 pieces of Rs. 1000 and Rs. 500 notes.

This new policy has kept the bankers busy addressing customers' needs as many flow in to exchange their notes.

TEENAGERS need nine hours of sleep each night to work properly the next day, according to researchers.

But results from a new survey suggest that less than half of young people manage to get that much rest.

Jane Ansell, founder of the Sleep Scotland charity, quizzed pupils at three schools in the country. She found that 1 in 5 students fell asleep in class at least once a fortnight.

Ansell also discovered that 52% of the young people she met didn't get nine hours sleep.

"We have probably not understood how important sleep is," she said. "It affects your growth. If you don't have enough sleep, your short term memory doesn't [add to] your long term memory, which is going to affect your school grades."
